





While the bulk of the roughly 1,700 Citizen-Airmen who make up the 127th Wing at Selfridge Air National Guard Base live in Macomb (457 members); Oakland (264); Wayne (207); or St. Clair (154) counties, about 600 Selfridge Airmen live outside these counties and commute to the base at least monthly to perform their military duties. A small handful of Airmen live outside the state and commute to be a part of the wing at Selfridge.




Total Annual Economic Impact of Selfridge Air National Guard Base

A new **\$36 million** jet fuel storage and delivery system is in the final planning stages at Selfridge. The system, which will have a capacity of approximately 630,000 gallons, will feature an eight-station hydrant pad.

Construction of the system is to begin in FY2015 with completion expected in FY2017. The project will significantly enhance KC-135 operations at the base.



Selfridge Air National Guard Base was originally named Selfridge Field in 1917. In 1947, it became known as Selfridge Air Force Base. In 1971, the Michigan Air National Guard took over operation of the base and the current name was put in to use. Today, the base is home to operations of all branches of the U.S. military, as well as several Dept. of Homeland Security agencies.

127th Wing Plays Key Role in Operation Northern Strike

Again in summer 2014, the 127th Wing supported the Michigan-based Operation Northern Strike with dozens of aircraft sorties and hundreds of Airmen. Centered at two of the nation's largest National Guard training facilities – Michigan's Camp Grayling Joint Military Training Center and the Alpena Combat Readiness Training Center – Operation Northern Strike is an annual National Guard Bureau-sponsored Combined Live Fire Exercise. The exercise blends Maneuver, Close Air Support (CAS), Joint Fire Support, and Air Mobility in both Major Combat Operations and limited Operation Enduring Freedom scenarios. Active duty forces and Army and Air National Guard forces from more than a dozen states, as well as several coalition partners, participated in the exercise. The 4th annual iteration of ONS is
