Mission Statement

Our Mission is Caring. We support the military lifestyle while reducing conflict between mission readiness and parental responsibilities. When a Soldier loses duty time during deployment, mobilization or contingency situations due to a lack of childcare, it negatively impacts the military mission. CYS provides critical support services to mitigate such stressors.

Rain Out/Cancellations

Youth Sports & Fitness will use the rain out line for updates or other cancellations. Rain out line: 586-282-9000. Child Development Centers, School Age Before/After & scheduled School Out Days will use 282-TANK as well as the Facebook Page. Middle School & Teen After School program will run as long as the school is open. All other programs and activities will contact directly.

Patron Eligibility

CYS accepts children as young as six weeks through eighteen years old in CYS programs. Eligible patrons of Department of Defense (DoD) Child Development Programs (CDP) include active duty military personnel; DoD civilian personnel paid from both appropriate funds (APF) and non-appropriate funds (NAF), reservists on active duty or during inactive duty personnel training and DoD contractors.

The first priority is childcare for Active Duty military and DoD civilian personnel.

Coast Guard when activated are eligible patrons. The eligibility criteria and priority is the same as any other Active Duty soldier. Fees are based on their TFI.

Retired military personnel are eligible to use youth programs. Child care programs are provided for retirees on a space available basis. Retired military personnel and eligible partnership youth (Macomb County) are eligible to use SKIES, and Sports and Fitness programs where fees are not based on TFI.

Refunds

Refunds are authorized for: (a) program closures for repair or renovation when an alternate care setting is not provided (b) unexpected prolonged child absence due to Family emergency or extended illnesses (c) withdrawal from a regularly scheduled child care programs upon receipt of PCS orders and (d) withdrawal from a Youth Sport (occurring before midseason of the sport) upon receipt of PCS orders. Forms are available at Parent Central Services or at your program facility.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

Q. I have used CYS in the past but I'm not sure if my paperwork is still good. What should I do?

A. Contact Parent Central Services to look at your file and they will work with you ensure your information is up to date. Call 586-282-9122 for Detroit Arsenal CDC, SAC, and MST programs and 586-239-5588 for Bryant CDC and Youth Sports or email

usarmy.detroit.id-sustainment.mbx.fmwr-cyss-central-registration@army.mil

Q. I have tried to make a payment online but receive an error when checking out. How can I fix this?

A. First ensure you are not using a government device to access. If you continue having issues, clear the cache on your browser and try again.

Q. I have logged into Webtrac before but I have forgotten my password.

Q. What services does Detroit Arsenal CYS provide?

A. We provide the following:

- Full-day child care
- Youth Sports
- Seasonal Camps
- Open recreation for teens
- Hourly care
- Strong Beginnings Pre-K program
- Recreational classes
- Before/after-school programs



FAQ (cont.)

Q. What can be provided as proof of eligibility?

A. The sponsor's ID card or DEERS enrollment forms that prove legal guardianship. If the sponsor is a biological parent, a birth certificate works, too.

Q. What do I need to register?

- Government ID
- Contact information
- Two emergency contacts
- Immunization Documentation, unless school age children are enrolled in a local public school system where proof of current vaccination is required
- Deployment orders (if applicable)
- LES/pay voucher, student letter, or seeking employment verification (for on-base child care)
 - Health assessment or sports physical may be required

Q. How often must I register and why?

A. The Department of Defense requires children's records be updated at least annually for their health, safety, or well-being.

Q. When does my child need a sports physical?

A. Sports physicals are required by the first practice for your child to participate in all team and individual sports. The child may not participate until a sports physical has been completed by a physician.



FAQ (cont.)

Q. Are immunizations required to register?

A. Yes. Kids five years and under need proof of immunizations. So do school age children not enrolled in a local public school system where proof of vaccination is required. Homeschool children are required to provide a copy of their immunization records.

Q. What if my child needs special accommodations?

A. We welcome children with special needs. Every child will receive a recommended care plan based on the information presented from the Multi-disciplinary Inclusion Action Team.

Q. What does DTA CDC, SAC, MST, and YSF stand for?

A. DTA CDC = Detroit Arsenal Child Development Center, SAC = School Age Care MST = Middle School and Teen, YSF = Youth Sports and Fitness

Q. Who are partnership children/youth?

A: Detroit Arsenal CYS has partnerships with L'Anse Creuse Public Schools, Mount Clemens Community Schools and Macomb Community Action. Therefore students in those districts or in Macomb County are eligible to participate in our SAC, MST, YSF programs. We refer to these students as partnership children/youth. Military and Dept of Defense children/youth have priority, but we almost always have spaces available for partnership families to fill.
